The Embassy of the Republic of the Philippines presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Singapore and has the honor to refer to the latter's Note No. MFA/PD1/00033/2001 of 25 August 2001.

The Embassy is pleased to confirm the acceptance of the amendments to the Air Transport Agreement between the Government of the Republic of the Philippines and the Government of the Republic of Singapore signed on 11 July 1974 as contained in the Confidential Memorandum of Understanding on Air Transport between the Republic of the Philippines and the Republic of Singapore signed on 25 August 2001.

The Ministry's Note and this Note constitute the confirmation of the amendments pursuant to Article 14 of the Air Transport Agreement, and the amendments shall come into immediate effect.

The Embassy of the Republic of the Philippines avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Singapore the assurances of its highest consideration.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Singapore presents its compliments to the Embassy of the Republic of the Philippines and has the honour to refer to the Air Transport Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Singapore and the Government of the Republic of the Philippines signed on 11 July 1974 and to the discussions which took place in the Philippines between representatives of the two Governments on 20 August 2001 for the purpose of modifying the terms of the Air Transport Agreement.

The representatives of the two Governments have agreed that the Air Transport Agreement be amended:-

- (a) by deleting Article 3(1) and substituting a new Article 3(1) as follows:-

"Article 3(1)

Each Contracting Party shall have the right to designate in writing to the other Contracting Party one or more airlines for the purpose of operating the agreed air services, and to withdraw or alter such designations."

- (b) by deleting the Annex and substituting a new Annex as shown in the Appendix to this Note.

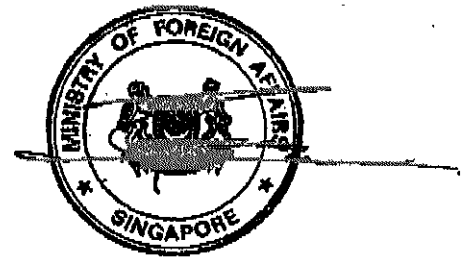

**Schedule II**

Airlines designated by the Government of the Republic of the Philippines shall be entitled to operate air services on the routes specified with full traffic rights, in both directions, and to make scheduled landings in the Republic of Singapore at the points specified in this paragraph –

Origin	Intermediate Points	Destination Points	Points Beyond
Manila, Cebu, Davao	Kuala Lumpur, Bangkok, Jakarta, Bandar Seri Begawan	Singapore	Kuala Lumpur, Bangkok, Jakarta

**Notes:**

1. The designated airline or airlines of the Philippines may omit any one of the intermediate and/or beyond points in any direction.
2. The designated airline or airlines of the Philippines may operate to Singapore from Manila, Cebu or Davao directly or via any one or two of these points.

## ANNEX

Schedule I

Airlines designated by the Government of the Republic of Singapore shall be entitled to operate air services on the routes specified with full traffic rights, in both directions, and to make scheduled landings in the Republic of the Philippines at the points specified in this paragraph –

Origin	Intermediate Points	Destination Points	Points Beyond
Singapore	Osaka, Seoul, Bandar Seri Begawan	Manila, Cebu, Davao	Osaka, Seoul, Bandar Seri Begawan

Notes:

1. The designated airline or airlines of Singapore may omit any one of the intermediate and/or beyond points in any direction.
2. The designated airline or airlines of Singapore may operate between Manila, Cebu and Davao in the Philippines and Singapore with co-terminal rights and own stopover rights. No cabotage rights may be exercised.
